SYNOPSIS

Umut is a water polo player, a gentle & quiet high school senior, trying to live his life in a complicated world. When a fellow player spreads a rumour that Umut is gay, he refuses to comment on it.

Feeling the world has no right to know either way.

While Selma & Sinan struggle with their relationship Umut's insistent refusal spirals the problem into something uncontrollable, until one day Umut disappears.

As they search for their son, Selma & Sinan come to realize that they have been lost themselves. Facing an uncertain future, they must come to terms with not knowing any of the answers.



DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

We live in an age of prejudice & intolerance. As the amount of information available increases with new technologies private and emotional lives are consumed like objects.

When making this family drama I used water polo as a metaphor.

Foul play is not permitted, but players engage in it under the water.

This resembles people's social relationships.

In my use of camera (the "omniscient point-of-view") I wanted nobody to know everything & have tried to make a film in which we don't know any character's full story, but experience their doubt & prejudice. My aim is to confront a world full of ignorance and prejudice by addressing one small part of it.

When we talk about a new era of Post Truth, I believe that our problems are more deeply rooted, and I aim to touch on one [of them] with this film: that we so often believe without knowing what is right, and judge without certainty.

[Something that seems ever more pertinent in the world we live in today, as we see social media create division and not harmony and watch our political discourse descend into verbal abuse]

I hope Not Knowing is a gripping film with an element which touches viewers hearts in it's finale.



PRODUCERS STATEMENT

When I first read the script for Bilmemek you could see it was a brave and challenging film. It asks its audience to think, and hopefully as a result of that it touches them in a way many other films can't. It asks them to imagine how it feels to be in the position we leave Selma and Sinan. Life is uncertain and complicated, and so often our films simplify the experience. That's great for easy entertainment but there has always been an audience who want to empathise with others, to be challenged in our comfort zones.

I watched Leyla's first film Bir Avuc Deniz and could see she's a director with a lot of potential (Bir Avuc Deniz had a very limited festival run where it won awards at three out of the four festivals it was in before selling to HBO).

In Bilmemek, Leyla has written and directed a great film. Her ability to get strong realistic performance from her cast is fantastic, she's not directing for stage with a camera, more replicating real life that we're able to watch.

The response we've had has been really good. We submitted to Cannes and Sundance and received personal emails from both Christian Jeune & Kim Yutani telling us they liked the film and felt Leyla is someone to watch, but they simply didn't have the space. As a Producer i checked out if these were just niceties, and some very experienced contacts told me only one or two films a year get these

emails & they show we made it almost all the way.

We've followed that by winning awards at three of the four big Turkish festivals, and we now feel it's time to sell. We're keen to release the film to Turkish audiences, and know that if we want a global sale that may be impacted by a prior local release. So we're looking to talk about what options might be possible. We hope you like the film and see what we see in it.

The film has been very well received by Turkish festival audiences & Critics, and we've got a lot of press waiting to give us coverage in Turkey (we're holding them off until we release).

We've had good feedback from sales agents, but we'd prefer to try and sell directly before giving it to one of them to sell for us.

We think we offer a chance to take a well regarded local film from a fresh & different voice and show it to the world. Currently we are available for sale in all territories.
